- 1) This epic poem recounts the life of one Spain's greatest Christian heroes and is the oldest existing poem in the Spanish language.
- 2) This is Chaucer's classic work relating the stories told by Pilgrim's traveling to the shrine of St. Thomas Becket.
- 3) The Divine Comedy, a 14th century epic considered to be one of the foremost works of Christian literature, is popularly known by this name.
- 4) This autobiography of Therese of Lisieux was intended only for her Carmelite sisters, but gained enormous popularity after her death.
- 5) This energetic American priest was a prolific author and teacher, who gained national recognition as radio and television preacher in the mid 20th century.
- 6) This classic work of apologetics offers a brilliant critique of the follies of modernism and is G. K. Chesterton's and exemplary work.
- 7) This famous manuscript is a lavishly illuminated version of the four gospels, thought to date from an Irish monastery of the 8th century.
- 8) This play by Robert Bolt recounting the inspiring life and death of St. Thomas More was made into an Oscar winning movie.
- 9) This historical drama, starring Charlton Heston, tells the story of a Jewish nobleman, unjustly enslaved by the Romans, who becomes a follower of Christ.
- 10) This original movie chronicles the heroic, but little known struggle of the Mexican people against their vicious, atheistic government in the 1920s
- 11) This gripping drama is based on the true story of Msgr. Hugh O'Flaherty, an Irish priest who saved thousands of Jews and allied soldiers from Nazis.
- 12) This historical drama is set in Paraguay during the 18th century when the Jesuits settlements in the area were destroyed and raided by local colonists.

15) This Roman-Jewish historian wrote a history of the Jewish Revolt in 70 A.D.

16) This scholar-monk from Jarrow Abbey authored Ecclesiastical History of England cover Britain from Roman times to the 8th century.

17) This is the name of the official Vatican newspaper.

18) These short religious dramas, arranged and performed by medieval guilds, were short re-enactments of scenes from the Bible performed on feast days.

19) This is the name of G.K. Chesterton's epic poem about the Battle of Ethandun where in Christian Saxons prevailed over the Pagan Danes.

**20)** This is the author of Lepanto a heroic poem that tells of 'Don John of Austria' and the epic battle of the Holy League against the Ottoman Turks.

21) The Seven Terraces of Purgatorio in the Divine comedy correspond to these seven entities.

22) This book of saint stories, compiled in the 13th century, was a popular reference work throughout Europe for hundreds of years.
