## HS:5 – Ministry of Christ — Q/A

*Recommended Reading for this unit is RSV Bible, Gospels of Matthew Chapter 1-21, and Gospel of John Chapters 1-11. Also see Gilmour's Bible History for Children.*

- 1) This person said, "Behold the lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world."
- 2) These two men were followers of John the Baptist who became the first two disciples of Jesus.
- 3) This first public miracle performed by Christ took place at the marriage feast in Cana.
- 4) At this event Jesus said: "Destroy this temple and I will raise it again in three days."
- 5) Jesus called these two men to be his disciples by saying: Come ye after me and I will make you to be fishers of men."
- 6) The story of the Annunciation, and Mary's response to the Angel Gabriel is recorded in this gospel.
- 7) This cruel Jewish ruler tried to kill Jesus as a baby because he feared that Jesus would take his throne.
- 8) Jesus was speaking to this person when he said: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son that whoever believe in him may not perish."
- 9) Jesus proclaimed the sanctity of marriage when he said "For what God has joined together let no man put asunder," during this discourse.
- 10) The Sermon on the Mount, the longest discourse of Jesus in the Bible, can be found in chapters 5-7 of this Gospel.
- 11) When the Pharisee expressed surprise that Jesus allowed a woman who was a great sinner to wash his feet with ointment, he told this parable. (Lk 7)

- 12) The pronouncement of Jesus that one cannot serve two masters, given during the Sermon on the Mount, refers to these two masters.
- 13) In this parable Jesus assures us that the kingdom of heaven is just as accessible to sinners who repent late in life as it is to those who live righteously.
- 14) The voice of God was heard to say "This is my beloved son in whom I am well pleased" at these events.
- 15) These three men were with Jesus on the Mountain of Transfiguration, when his garments became "white as snow", and his face shown like the sun.
- 16) In this parable, Jesus says that there will be more joy in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine righteous people.
- 17) In many stories from the Bible, the term publican referred to someone whose profession was this.
- 18) Jesus fed the multitude gathered by the Sea of Galilee by multiplying this food brought to him by his apostles.
- 19) This parable tells of a young man who took his inheritance and left home, only to lose all the money and return a poor beggar.
- 20) This parable explains that in order for one to be forgiven for their own sins, they must forgive all those who trespass against them.
- 21) This town near Jerusalem was the home of Martha, Mary and Lazarus, where Jesus frequently stayed during his missions.
- 22) When Jesus cured this person at the pond in Bethesda, the Jews confronted him and accused him of breaking the Sabbath.
- 23) This parable explains that God has chosen to allow the bad to exist along side the good, and will punish the wicked on the day of Judgment.
- 24) In the parable of the sower and the seed, Christ identified this as the seed that was scattered on many types of soil.
