- 1) This prophet was the greatest and last of the judges, and as high priest he anointed the first two kings of Israel.
- 2) This man was anointed as the first King of Israel by the prophet Samuel.
- 3) This son of Saul was a friend of David and led a successful revolt against the Philistines.
- 4) This king of the Israelites is considered the most important composer of the Psalms.
- 5) This prince, the eldest son of Bathsheba, became King of Israel after the death of his father David.
- 6) This 8th century prophet of Israel was commanded by God to go to Nineveh, the capital of Assyria, and prophesy against their wickedness.
- 7) This woman greatly wanted a child and finally bore a son name Samuel whom she dedicated to the Lord.
- 8) The high priest Eli died when he heard that his sons had been killed in battle and that this had been captured by the Philistines.
- 9) Jesse, the father of David and the Grandson of Ruth and Boaz, was a prosperous rancher from this town.
- 10) King David coveted this woman and arranged for her husband to be killed in battle so that he might marry her.
- 11) After David was anointed as king he brought the Ark of the Covenant to this city and made plans to build a temple to house it.

- 12) This noble woman traveled to Solomon's court from distant lands to see if the rumors of its wealth and splendor were true.
- 13) This king of the Israelites is thought to have written the books of Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Songs.
- 14) After Solomon's death, ten of the tribes of Israel revolted against his son Rehoboam, and chose this prince for their king instead.
- 15) This was the capital of the Northern Kingdom of Israel, founded by Jeroboam when he led a rebellion against the son of Solomon.
- 16) This pagan queen of Israel, the wife of king Ahab, built a temple to Baal and appointed 450 priests to serve him.
- 17) When the prophet Elijah was near death, God took him up to Heaven in this way.
- 18) After three years of drought, the prophet Elijah challenged these people to meet him at Mount Carmel to offer sacrifice to their God.
- 19) Naboth of Samaria was stoned to death by agents of Jezebel because he refused to sell this to king Ahab.
- 20) These two prophets were sent to the Northern Kingdom of Israel to warn of God's judgment during the reign of Ahab and Jezebel.
- 21) This prophet was with Elijah when he was taken to heaven in a fiery chariot and succeeded him as prophet to the Northern Kingdom.
- 22) In 720 B.C. this Assyrian king conquered the Northern Kingdom of Israel and sent its people into exile.
- 23) This phrase describes the people of the Northern Kingdom of Israel who were conquered by Sargon II of Assyria and sent into Exile.
- 24) After Jonah had lived in the belly of a great fish for three days, the Lord again commanded him to go to this city and prophesize to the people.
