- 1) This was the land in Egypt where most of the Israelites lived until they were allowed to return to their promised land.
- 2) When Moses killed the Egyptian overseer and fled into the desert, he stayed with this tribe of people for forty years.
- 3) This high priest was a brother of Moses and was chosen by God to speak for Moses.
- 4) This was the mountain upon which God spoke from the burning bush and commanded Moses to go lead the Israelites to freedom.
- 5) This was the sacred enclosure which housed the tablets upon which were inscribed the Ten Commandments.
- 6) Moses dashed the stone tablets on which the ten commandments were written when he saw Aaron and the people worshiping this.

- 8) This man was excluded from the Promised Land because of his lack of confidence in God at the "Waters of Contradiction."
- 9) Moses chose seventy elders to help him govern the people and these were the beginning of this Jewish tribunal.
- 10) This was the first plague that the lord sent to Egypt.
- 11) This is the name of the Promised Land that God gave to the Israelites.

- 12) This Israelite hero, one of the twelves spies of Canaan, never murmured against the Lord and received the city of Hebron as a reward.
- 13) The angel of the Lord bade Joshua to march around this city for six days and on the seventh day, the city would surrender.
- 14) This man was Moses' successor and led the people into the promised land.
- 15) This woman assisted the spies of the Israelites, and was spared from the destruction of Jericho.
- 16) This prophetess, the only female judge mentioned in the Bible, sent Barak out in battle against the Canaanite chieftain, Sisera.
- 17) Instead of being apportioned their own land, this priestly tribe was supported by the other eleven other tribes of Israel.
- 18) Gideon was able to overrun the entire Midianite army with only 300 men by surrounding their camp at night and doing this.
- 19) This humble farmer used a lamb's fleece to demonstrate God's favor before leading the Israelites against the Midianites.
- 20) It order to show the power and glory of God, Gideon went to conquer the Midianites with only this many Israelite soldiers.
- 21) This worthless son of Gideon claimed to be king of Israel and killed seventy of his relatives so no one could dispute his claim.
- 22) When Delilah, Samson's wife, finally discovered the source of Samson's strength was keeping his vows as a Nazarite she did this.
- 23) With this weapon Samson laid a thousand Philistines low and put the remainder to flight.
