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HS:6 – Passion of Christ — Q/A

Recommended Reading for this unit is RSV Bible, Gospels of Matthew Chapter 21-28, and Gospel of John Chapters 12-21. Also see Gilmour's Bible History for Children.

- 1) This apostle kept the purse for the apostles and criticized a woman for washing the feet of Jesus with expensive perfumes.
- 2) In this parable, a King invites beggars, cripples and the poor to a wedding feast he has prepared after the invited guests refused.
- 3) In the parable of the lamps, five foolish virgins run out of oil for their lamps while waiting for this person.
- 4) In this parable a king gives money to three of his servants with instructions to use it wisely in his absence.
- 5) This is the upper room in Jerusalem where the Last Supper was celebrated and where the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles.
- 6) At the supper in which he instituted the Eucharist, Jesus and his disciples were gathered together to celebrate this Jewish feast.
- 7) The most detailed story of the last supper, including the foot washing and Christ's last discourse to his apostles, is given in this Gospel.
- 8) At this event, Jesus foretold the treason of Judas and told Peter he would deny him three times before the cock crowed.
- 9) After Peter proclaimed his faithfulness to his Lord, Jesus said that Peter would deny him three times before this happened.
- 10) This is where Jesus suffered the Agony in the Garden and was delivered by Judas to his enemies.
- 11) The scribes and elders who formed the Sanhedrin met at the home of this high priest, the leading prosecutor of Jesus.

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- 12) This Jewish leader spoke in Jesus' defense saying, "Does our law condemn a person before it first hears him and finds out what he is doing?"
- 13) When Peter heard the cock crow as he sat in the court of the Sanhedrin, awaiting the trial of Jesus, he did this.
- 14) This is the price that the Chief priests offered Judas for his betrayal of Jesus.
- 15) When Jesus said "For this I came into the world, that I should give testimony to the truth," this was Pontius Pilate's response.
- 16) This Roman governor of Judaea was responsible for sentencing Jesus to crucifixion.
- 17) When Pontius Pilate attempted to free Jesus due to the Jewish holy day, the Jews insisted he free this criminal instead.
- 18) This is the Hebrew name, meaning "place of the skull" for the hill on which Christ was crucified.
- 19) This person wrote "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews" on a plaque on the cross over the objections of the Jewish priests.
- 20) When Jesus stumbled carrying his cross, the soldiers commanded this person to help him.
- 21) Once Jesus reached Golgotha, the soldiers gave Jesus this to drink, but he refused it.
- 22) Jesus addressed this person with these words: "Today you will be with me in paradise."
- 23) When Jesus was on the Cross, He entrusted the care of his mother to this apostle, who stayed by his side during the crucifixion.
- 24) After Christ died on the cross, this person approached Pilate to ask for the body to be buried in a private tomb.
