TF:6 – Moral Teaching (Special) — Q/A

The primary reference for the following questions is Catholic Morality by Fr. John Laux (1932), Section II, Chapters 1-4. Similar material is covered in most Student Catechisms.

- 1) These are the three theological virtues.
- 2) This is a symbol of the theological virtue of Hope.
- 3) This Divine gift, infused by the Holy Spirit, enables a person to believe firmly all that God has revealed.
- 4) This is a baptized person who professes the Catholic faith, but denies or corrupts the dogmas upheld by the Church
- 5) This sin is deliberate refusal to hope in God.
- 6) We commit this sin when we continue in bad behavior with the intention of repenting before death.
- 7) This is a sin against the First Commandment, in which persons or things are worshiped in the place of God.
- 8) This is a sin is an abuse of faith by excessive belief in the supernatural powers of objects or persons.
- 9) This is the irreverent use of the Name of God, Jesus, or the saints, through impatience, jest, surprise or habit.
- 10) This is the contribution of a portion of one's income for the purposes of religion and charity.
- 11) This sin is sadness at another's good fortune or success.

12) Examples of this sin against charity are setting a poor example, or leading another into sin.

13) This term describes mercy killing or the hastening of one's death for the purpose of ending human suffering

14) This is excessive interest charged on loans and use of money.

15) This virtue entails unwavering loyalty and support to a person, institution, cause, or belief.

16) This sin is lying about another person and injuring his good name.

17) This is the sin of gossiping or revealing another's faults to a third person to injure a person's good name.

18) This commandment forbids lying, flattery, deception, and all forms of dishonesty and deception.

19) Euthanasia, abortion, suicide, dueling, and murder are sins against this commandment.

20) This commandment forbids stealing, cheating, usury, fraud, and failing to pay debts.

21) These commandments forbid any and all sins of impurity or unchaste behavior.

22) This is the Fourth Commandment.

23) This sin is inordinate self-regard or excessive estimation of one's own worth.

24) This sin is spiritual, mental or physical laziness which causes a person to neglect his duties.
