TF:8 – Clergy and Religious — Q/A

- 1) This is the official teaching authority of the Church, exercised by the pope and his bishops, whose pronouncements in doctrinal matters all Catholics are solemnly obliged to obey.
- 2) This is a declaration by the pope that a deceased person is raised to the full honors of sainthood.
- 3) This term, from the Greek word for "witness", refers to a person who is killed for the sake of his religious beliefs.
- 4) These were declared the four great Doctors of the Latin Church by Pope Boniface, who promoted their feast days in 1298.
- 5) There were no female doctors of the Church until 1970 when these two saints were formally proclaimed by Pope Paul VI.
- 6) This is a gathering of all bishops throughout the world, with the consent of the Pope, to exercise their collegial authority over the Universal Church.
- 7) This is the bishop's staff, symbolic of his pastoral authority and jurisdiction, used at liturgical functions.
- 8) This is the meaning of "Oro et Labora", the motto of the monks of the Order of St. Benedict (O.S.B.).
- 9) This is a person appointed to aid the priest by performing ceremonial duties, frequently an altar server or young man studying for the priesthood.
- 10) This is a priest appointed for the pastoral service of a secular institution, such as the armed forces, a hospital, a school, or a private chapel.
- 11) This is a high-ranking member of the Catholic hierarchy who has legal authority over a realm, such as a bishop, cardinal, abbot, or religious superior.
- 12) This is the title of the superior in a monastery who is the assistant of the Abbot.

- 13) The pope is elected by this body of men.
- 14) This term refers to the gathering of cardinals for the purposes of electing a new pope.
- 15) This is the name given to the officials who assist the Pope with the governance of the Church.
- 16) At the death of a pope, the College of Cardinals gather in this place to elect a new pope.
- 17) This is a letter on some important matter of faith or morals sent by the pope through the bishops to all the faithful.
- 18) This is a document issued by a pope on his own initiative (usually dealing with administrative matters).
- 19) The Holy See refers to the diocese served by Pope, and includes this area.
- 20) This term describes the historical and spiritual bonds that tie the 12 apostles to the bishops of the present time.
- 21) This is a declaration made by the pope that one of the faithful is living in the happiness of heaven and may be honored by the title "Blessed".
- 22) This is the title of a male saint who is not a martyr.
- 23) This term describes a person who is being investigated by the Catholic Church for possible canonization as a saint.
- 24) This is a title given to Servants of God after the state of their heroic virtue has been proven and recognized by a pope.
