

WT:6 – Rites and Liturgy — Q/A

Recommended Reading: Roman Missal, Catholic Source Book chapters 5.Liturgy, and Short History of the Roman Rite by Michael Davies.

- 1) This liturgical book, first composed in the Middle Ages, consists of all prayers and readings needed for a priest to celebrate a low mass.
- 2) This term, used mostly in the eastern Churches, defines the office and jurisdiction of the highest ranking ecclesiastical authority in a region.
- 3) This is the largest of the Eastern Catholic rites. It is very similar but not identical to the liturgy used by the Orthodox churches.
- 4) This book is a catalog of saints arranged in order of their feast days for inclusion in a liturgical calendar.
- 5) The earliest liturgical texts were divided among several books (Sacramentaries, Pontificals) for this reason.
- 6) This liturgical book contains all the rites, prayers, blessings and ceremonies performed exclusively by bishops.
- 7) This type of instruction for priests explaining how to perform a rite or ceremony, is usually written in red.
- 8) This is the oldest known type of liturgical book. It contained all prayers required by priests for administering mass and sacraments.
- 9) This was an important factor in providing for a standard and uniform Roman liturgy after the council of Trent.
- 10) This term, meaning gift, refers to the prayers said after the consecration when the body and blood of Christ are presented.
- 11) This term is used in the Eastern Church to describe the consecration, the most solemn part of the Divine Liturgy.

- 12) This term is used in the Eastern Churches to describe the sacrament of confirmation.
- 13) This is the most commonly celebrated form of the Eastern rite of the Divine Liturgy.
- 14)** This term is used in the Eastern Churches to describe the sacraments.
- 15) This is the number of 'Great Feasts' in the liturgical Calendar of the Eastern Church.
- 16) This Eucharistic practice, common in Byzantine rite services, involves the mixing of the sacred host and blood before communion.
- 17) This prayer, whose name means "thrice holy" is an important hymn in the Byzantine and Eastern Orthodox liturgies.
- 18) The term Eucharist is based on the Greek word Eukharistos meaning this.
- 19) This Eastern Church Father was given the name meaning "golden-mouthed" because of his exceptional preaching.
- 20)** The word 'Liturgy' evolved from the Greek term 'leitourgo' meaning this:
- 21) These are the two 'parent' liturgical rites of the Eastern Church from which all Greek based rites descend.
- 22) These two saints helped develop the prayers and liturgies associated with the Byzantine Rite and are honored in the Divine Liturgy.
- 23) This is the most widely used form of the ancient Alexandrian Rite, once the dominant rite throughout Christian North Africa.
- 24) These are the two 'parent' liturgical rites of the Western Church from which all Latin based rites descend.
